Subject: Elections of the Supreme Moslem Council.

I beg to inform you that the Supreme Moslem Council has decided to commence the elections as from the 1st November, 1925; we shall communicate this fact to the Election Commission through the Sharia Kadis and Mamurs of Wakfs.

We request you

(1) To ask the District Commissioners to assist, when necessary and upon being requested, in all the affairs connected with the election.

(2) To instruct the Police Authorities to put sufficient Police at the disposal of the Election Commissions for the maintenance of public order and in order that the elections be carried out without any interference.

(3) To instruct the officers of the Government, whether of the Legal Department or the Administration, not to interfere in the elections, whether directly or by any other means which would ~~have effect~~ <sup>be felt</sup> on the public.

The Council earnestly hopes that the elections will be carried out free from any interference. Moreover, it is for the public interest and in compliance with the wishes of officers of the Government themselves that such a step should be taken. Every officer of the Government should know that any interference on his part will render him responsible.

This Council will communicate these instructions to all its officers in order that the elections be free from any interference and intrigues.
