

Antiquities and Historical places in Arraba:

All around the old ages, Arraba city had practiced a wide political influence and power in Palestine, and the significant historical places existing there indicate the essential and special position of the city. Here is a brief summary about the significant historical places:

- 1- Dothan Hill: one of the major historical places in Palestine, and it is 3 kilometers to the east of Arraba. The excavations in this location showed the inhabitation of this area for 19 respective historical periods especially the bronze Kana'ani era.
 - 2- Al-Kherba: (3 km) to the West of Arraba – ruins of a historical Roman location.
 - 3- Al-Mahfar Kherba and Hill: (4 km) North of Arraba – ruins of Roman and Bezantic remains; and Bronze and Kana'ani remains.
 - 3- Kherbat Al-Harayeq: (1.5 km) North of Arraba - ruins of Roman and Bezantic remains.
 - 4- Kherbat Amer: (2 km) South of Arraba - ruins of Roman remains.
 - 5- Kherbat El-Shona: (1 km) East of Arraba - ruins of Bezantic remains.
 - 6- Around Abu Addawayeb location: Middle of Arraba – signpost of a Bezantic church which can be discovered.
 - 7- Bod Abu Obeid location: a very old oil mill from the Roman era.
 - 8- Al-Zawya: in the Wall area which is still exists; it was like a community for the Shathelia sect.
- Historical buildings like:
- A- Turkish Palace: or known as Al Abu Obeid Palace on the West Hill.
 - B- Al Abdel Hadi Palaces: are located on the East Hill, and 2 of them were repaired by funds from the UNDP.
