Subject: - Remuneration for Mukhtars Reference: Your H/1037/44 of 5-2-44

The suggestion that remuneration to Mukhtars should be based on the number of person whom each Mukhtar represents is open to the following objections:-

- (a) The expenses incurred by a Mukhtar, and the efficiency with which he discharges his duties are by no means dependant on the number of persons whom he represents.
- (b) The measure may lead to pressing demands for additional Mukhtars, which, when resisted might result in breaches of the peace.
- (c) In most villages there are Hamulehes who have no Mukhtar and there are also a certain number of persons who are not attached to any Hamuleh; both of them classes of persons can change their allegiance from one Mukhtar or another at will. When numbers supporting each Mukhtar begin to count for remuneration purposes there will be a continuous effort by every Mukhtar to bring to his side the greatest number of persons. This unstable state of affairs might at any time cause fasad with the result out breach of the peace.
- (d) The annual change of population of each Hamuleh will create a good deal of office difficulty.
- 2. I am of opinion therefore that the suggestion should be amended in such a form as to make the vote of remuneration to Mukhtars at the discretion of the District Administration. My recommendations in detail are as follows:-
- (a) Mukhtars should be put into five grades, receiving LP. 60, LP. 48, LP. 36, LP. 24, and LP. 12. respectively. The last grade should be reserved to Mukhtars on probation and to such Mukhtars who are inefficient, but who cannot be replaced because there are no suitable persons in the village.
- (b) The appointment of a Mukhtar into any one of the grades should be entirely at the discretion of the District Administration, who should also have the discretion of paying amounts below the maximum of each grade.
- (c) Each Sub-District should be given a fixed maximum number of posts in each grade, and promotion would then be governed by efficiency and the existence of vacancies.
- (d) Normally a newly appointed Mukhtar should be placed in the fifth class receiving IP. 12 p. a. for a period of one year (or more if he is inefficient and cannot be replaced). Another year at least should be spent in the fourth class at IP. 24, where he should remain

  until his efficiency is proved, and he is then promoted to a higher grade as soon as a vacancy occurs.
- 3. Another convenient alteration would be as follows:-
  - (a) Prescribe a fixed remuneration for all Mukhtars say LP. 24 per annum.
- (b) Place at the disposal of the District Administration a lump sum to be paid at their discretion as a reward to those Mukhtars who performed specially good during the year and/or incurred specially heavy expenses, provided that no Mukhtar should be paid more than LP. 36. over and above his remuneration.
- (c) Acting Mukhtars and Mukhtars/might receive slightly less than the Mukhtars who are confirmed say LP. 18 per annum
- 4. These two alternative suggestion have the following in this favour:-
  - (a) They remove or at least minimize the objections referred to under (1) above.
  - (b) They provide an incentive for better work.
  - (c) They give a greater influence to the District Administration
  - (d) They provide an easy means for making the remuneration compatable with efficiency and/or with expenses incurred.
  - (e) The total remuneration could be more or less permanently fixed without annual fluctuation resulting from changes in population.
- 5. The Cost of the various proposals are shown in the Schedule A attached, while the data on which these costs have been worked are shown in Schedule B.
- As the present remuneration in Nablus Sub-District is being paid on the basis of the population of 1931, I found it necessary to show the costs of the various proposals based both on the present population and on the population of 1931.
